This year we have <u>£2500</u> of Primary PE and Sports Premium funding. We have drawn up this initial plan as to how this will be spent. However, one of our key priorities for development is to appoint a Sports Curriculum Leader, as we have had a number of successful applications for UPS in Spalding who are seeking a whole school responsibility. The strategic work done by this member of staff in Spalding will be available for Key Stage Leaders in Grantham, and they will be able to consult them as a PE expert for support and/or guidance. After this appointment we intend to allow the successful applicant to look at this plan, and develop it further with the support of SLT and Key Stage Leaders. This version of this plan is therefore an early draft – we expect changes to be made to it over the course of this year.

Our initial plan regarding our Primary PE and Sports Premium funding is to spend it in the following ways, to address the following key indicators:
